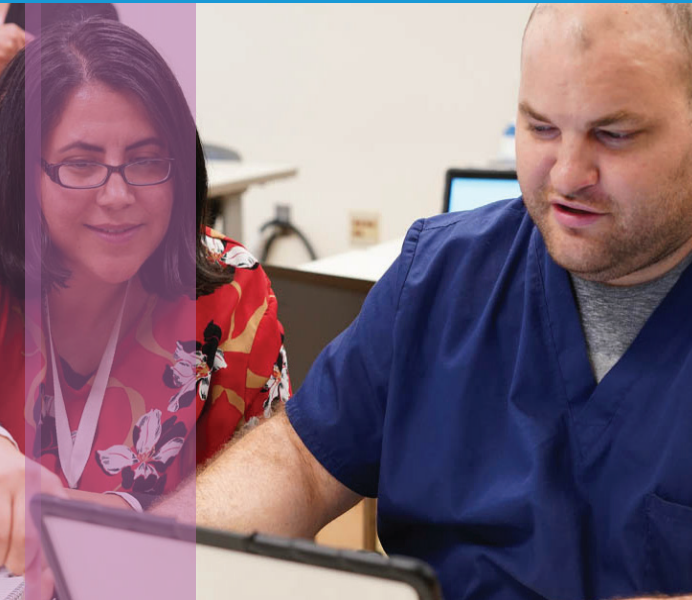

Building a LinkedIn Profile

Become familiar with the power and services available with this online networking tool.

Come to a Workshop

The Career Resource Center hosts weekly workshops to assist students with employability and soft skills. Students have the opportunity to attend an annual career fair and are recommended to review the companies and do their own research before attending and meeting with prospective employers.

LinkedIn Learning and Portfolium

NOCE is now offering LinkedIn Learning, an online educational platform that helps students discover and develop business, technology-related, and creative skills through expert-led course videos. Instructors are incorporating LinkedIn Learning into their curriculum.

In addition, NOCE has purchased licenses for Portfolium, an e-portfolio network designed for you to visually showcase the academic and professional work you've completed.
